Students that participate will keep the money they raise.

A business fee of 10% of what you make must be given back to the school. You will need to count your money at the end of every day and fill out a report to keep track of your money.

Students will be given a "spot" where they will sell items.

Please read the guidelines below to make sure you understand the guidelines.

GUIDELINES:

- Each student will be given a small table to sell their items/goods. You must keep your area clean before, after, and during the event. Any area not kept clean may be subject to shut down.
- Items must be new and not used.
- Remember, your target audience is <u>kids</u>. Make sure what you sell is not so expensive that they cannot
 afford to purchase from you. Ask yourself these questions: Would YOU purchase what you are selling?
 Would YOU purchase what you are selling for the cost you are selling the item?
- It is up to you to advertise what you are selling. You can make a store sign, brochure, handout, etc.
- Items must be clearly priced, so your customers know what they are purchasing.
- Students who have over 1 involved in your business: Designate someone to oversee making money and change. *Do not have several people in charge of your store money.*
- You are in charge of where you get your items, whether purchased or donated. Items can be brought or donated from home, handmade, etc.
- How much did it cost you to get or make your item? How much will you sell it for to make a profit based on that cost?
- The school will allow over one student or class to sell similar items. Ensure you advertise your item well enough that customers want to purchase from you and not another store.
- If you sell food of any type, it MUST be individually wrapped and clean!
- This is NOT for parents to run. Your parent(s) can help you at home to put things together, etc., however, it is the students responsibility to set up their table, run their business, etc.
